12th Grade Exit Survey

The purpose of this survey is to learn about students' postsecondary plans and preparations, as well as get their contact information. This allows schools to follow up with graduates and help students achieve their goals after high school.

Create a survey

Online: We recommend collecting survey responses online. This makes reviewing your results, sharing and using your data easier.

We provide a Google survey that you can copy and save as your own. Your school will need a Google account in order to host the survey. Go to <u>bit.ly/12thgradeexitsurvey</u> and select "Make a copy." A copy of the survey will be saved to your own Google forms folder.

Print: A printable version of the survey is available on pages 2-4.

Add custom questions

You may add custom questions to the survey. Questions should be designed to help your school support your 12th graders in the future, and better prepare current students. Be thoughtful about the number of questions you add so the survey doesn't get too long. To add questions to the online survey, click on the "+" in the right-hand sidebar and choose the type of question you want to add.

When to survey

The recommended time to survey is late May and early June, preferably as late as possible but before students finish their coursework. All 12th graders should take the survey during the same day or week.

Instructions

Check technology. If students will take surveys on the schools' computers or tablets (recommended), test the technology to make sure it is equipped with the latest versions of Internet Explorer, Google Chrome, and/or Apple Safari, and that it also works on browser-ready tablets and smartphones.

Explain surveys to students & teachers. The purpose of this survey is to learn about students' postsecondary plans and preparations, as well as get their contact information. This allows schools to follow up with graduates and help students achieve their goals after high school. For this reason, surveys are not anonymous, and student-identified information should not be shared with anyone outside the school. Precautions should be taken to protect the confidential nature of student data.

Launch your school's survey. You can share your survey via a link or embedded on your website.

View survey results. Survey results can be viewed by selecting the Responses tab when viewing the survey form from within your school's Google account. Results are also available to download in spreadsheet form via the menu option "Download responses (.csv)".


